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



Making All The Pieces Fit; The WLD NMRA, Modelers, Hobby Shops, and Clubs

As I will be stepping down as Superintendent in 2013, I thought it would be a good idea to write down some thoughts of where we've been as a division over the last several years. I also wanted to follow up on an article written roughly 5 years ago as to where I hoped we would be as a group by 2012. We've had some successes, but work still needs to be done in several areas. Once again in this case I'm speaking my opinions, not necessarily the opinions of the Board of Directors or the people who will take the job of Superintendent in years to come.

Certainly, the most encouraging thing I've seen is the attendance of our WLD Spring and Fall Meets steadily climb. It should be our goal to further this success by continuing to offer activities for experienced modelers and for those looking to improve their modeling skills and knowledge of the hobby. While we traditionally welcome the general public, most of our meet activities are now geared towards you, the NMRA member, rail historian, and skilled modeler. I would hope you mark the dates on your calendar or i-device and plan on attending the upcoming meets. While we all have interests outside the hobby we really need more NMRA members to make us their priority that day and attend.

An issue that has been discussed recently at our BOD meetings is what I would describe as the frugality of people, including many model railroaders, in our area. I know we have a lot to offer today at our meets, but I've heard several comments that are along the lines of "why should I pay for "your" meet when I can see clinics for free at my hobby shop or online?" To that I answer that our meets are usually only \$5.00 to attend and while it's a good thing clinics are offered at hobby shops, they usually don't have several going on during a day and they don't include layout tours. Of course the real reason may be not the entry fee to the meet, but the gas prices to travel to it. There's nothing we can do about that other than suggest a carpool across this large division. I have predicted to some BOD members that the time may be coming where everyone will be required to have a membership in the NMRA to attend a WLD meet. In other divisions which hold monthly meets, this is the norm. As we hold only 2 meets per year, we are well within our rights (for now) to continue the generous policy of letting guests (non-NMRA members) in to attend our clinics and layout tours. The hobby in this area is already splintered, helped in part due to the large boundaries of the WLD. What perhaps needs to happen first is that NMRA members get a price break on attending our meets or maybe a new NMRA Railpass member could attend a WLD meet for free if they join the NMRA at our event. I don't think we're doing anyone a favor by restricting meet attendance, but we may come to a point in time where the policy of the National NMRA will force it upon us. The job we have is to stay ahead of the curve.

Tied in with this is the recent slow, but steady decline in WLD membership. I knew we'd have a huge bounce with the National Convention in 2010 due to the policy of layout owners needing to be members in order to be seriously considered for a visit from a National layout tour bus. We topped 200 members at one point, but now shrunk back to 150. Yes, some have members have died since 2010, but many who dropped out just don't want to spend the money to belong. Many of them don't attend our meets either, so my question is simple: Why? We are trying to do our part making membership worthwhile as mentioned with our meets, but for some reason we just can't make the connection with them to realize that in a way, their National NMRA membership allows us to continue to bring our local meets affordably to them or their modeling friends.

The WLD/NMRA is not the "be-all/end all" authority in Wisconsin model railroading. I have always seen the group as a piece of the puzzle in making the hobby more fun and educational. We in the leadership roles of the WLD have got to work with and take advantage of our partners in the hobby; our strong hobby shops, local clubs, and the non-NMRA modeler for the hobby itself to thrive and grow in our area. We have done this over the last several years, but there's room for improvement on both sides.

One thing I see as an active modeler or Superintendent that troubles me enough to single it

out in this piece, (though it's sometimes inevitable), is when a club schedules an event in our division opposite of our annual spring or fall meet. This also extends down to the hobby shop level. It makes no sense to me why we must "compete" for modeler attendance with WLD-area clubs or why a store in our division would run a series of their own clinics during our meets, no matter where they are held, to further dilute the potential attendees at a WLD meet. I personally find it a lack of courtesy to the division that in many cases helped those entities years ago and in some cases continue to help them in various ways today. Our meets are not secret society events. They are posted in some cases almost a year in advance. Info is mailed to all NMRA members and shops twice a year. Everyone can find out where, when, and what will be offered. Having a hobby shop or a club do a clinic at *our* event on that day instead of on their own or in their store would be much appreciated and appropriate. We need all the help we can get in driving up attendance.

Instead of just complaining about this, I think there are some possible answers that would benefit both the WLD and the groups mentioned above. For instance, if you are a member of a club, why not develop a small traveling display or layout? Leave the big 50'x50' loop of track layout that takes an army to set up behind and think about presenting your group at one of our upcoming meets with a smaller prototypical display or switching layout. People move every day due to job changes, etc. and I would think it might be a good idea to promote your group to modelers in other cities as well since they may be your neighbors soon. This would also help take care of the old issue that plagues a club: not enough help set up or tear down that triple track layout. Same general idea goes for our local hobby shops- minimize the display. Bring along a select group of items geared towards the cliental at the WLD Meet or the town in which the meet is being held. Perhaps bring a special closeout item? Let's face it, with the conservative nature here in Wisconsin, most people are either waiting for a blowout price at Trainfest or buying online at deep discount anyways. What I hope would happen someday is that a few members from each club or from a hobby shop could attend our meets, rent a table for a day. and then communicate/interface with other modelers. Building commeraderie with other modelers is what we're talking about. As an example, just last year many people got to know the active modelers in Wausau better and I look forward to visiting with them again soon.

In conclusion, I know most of the above sounds like the ramblings of someone who's burnt out of the job of leading the WLD. In reality, that's not the case. While I do need a break to concentrate on my own affairs, the Supers job is quite fun. It can be as hard or as easy as you want to make it. As an experienced modeler my goals in the Superintendent's position were to suggest and guide the Board of Directors into transforming the WLD into a more active division and one that holds its meets twice a year that I personally would like to attend with advanced clinics and content. Luckily, I was able to fill BOD positions with other experienced modelers and talented people who are willing to devote serious time to the job of promoting the NMRA. As a fellow member, I want you to know I'm excited about the people who are coming into office later this year. While most of the goals that were mentioned back in 2008 have been met, it's possible that if all interested parties could make the pieces fit just a little closer, we'd have a chance to "circle the wagons" with all modelers working closer to really expand the hobby within our area and build new friendships. That will be the goal of those who lead us in 2013 and beyond. It has been an honor serving as your Superintendent. Perhaps our rails will cross again down the road.



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
