






Superintendent's Report ...

This seems like the perfect opportunity to introduce myself to the Division. My name is James Cruthers and I am fairly new to the hobby of model railroading and to the NMRA. I grew up on a dairy farm near the village of Luck in Polk County Wisconsin and as a kid had opportunities to watch the Soo Line run trains in that area. I have lived in La Crosse, Eau Claire, Menomonie, Wisconsin Rapids, and in 2006 after accepting a job in Menasha/Appleton, my partner and I settled in Hilbert (Calumet County).

Back in 2006 I began to explore the area of model railroading and soon learned about the NMRA, which I joined in January 2007. Not too much had happened and then one evening in early 2008 I received a phone call from Brian Cassidy who was at the time Chief Clerk of the Winnebagoland Division. He asked if I would be interested in becoming an officer for the Division as the position of Chief Clerk was becoming available. I told him I would be interested before I really knew what the position was about. He encouraged me to attend the Division's next Board meeting to learn more about the Division and the position, which I did and told them they could place my name on the ballot; I soon found myself elected. As of this time I have served four consecutive years as Chief Clerk and one year on the Division Board of Directors, I am now the new Superintendent.

My philosophy was and still is that if I am going to be a member of an organization I want to be involved. It is important for me to be able to 'give back' to an organization and its members the way the organization gives to me. Please do not misunderstand me. I agreed to continue to serve the Division but there are many ways to get involved in the Division other than in an elected capacity. We really do need your help. The Division always needs volunteers to help in a variety of ways. One of the things I really hope to accomplish during my year as Superintendent is to support more of a committee approach to the work that needs to get done within the Division. By clearly defining the work the committees need to accomplish it would be easier for two or three people to 'divide and conquer' the work rather than one person handling everything for that particular committee. Right now we need people to

help with the membership committee and the convention committee. If we get enough people willing to volunteer it makes everyone's job easier. Maybe you or someone you know would be willing to teach a clinic at either our spring or fall meet, enter the photo and or model contest, or attend the fall Operating Session. Attend one of the Division meets. My point is that there are many ways to get involved. I hope to get to know more of you over the next year. If you or someone you know may be interested in volunteering some time for the Division feel free to contact me or another Board member for more information.

Please check out the new layout of the Division website. Mike and Mary Eiden of Stevens Point are now a co-chairs for the Website Committee and Mike has put a new look to the website. Remember that we have a fall meet coming up October 12, 2013 in Rhinelander, WI that is sure to be informative and a great time. Our Operating Session is set for November 2, 2013 out Waupaca way. Over the past couple of months we added the following people to the Board of Directors, they are: Roger Wurtzel (Plover), Wally Rogers (Menasha), Mike Wadinski (Wausau), David Nitsch (Plymouth), Joe Lallensack (Manitowoc), and Todd Bushmaker (Green Bay). Even though Lynn Jasch served her last year as Paymaster she has agreed to continue as Registrar for our spring and fall meets and be part of a convention committee. Scott Payne (Sheboygan) is the new Paymaster. Gregg Condon and Larry Easton will continue as Assistant Superintendent and Chief Clerk respectively. Directors who will continue to serve their terms include: Vern Ehlke (Little Chute), Emory Luebke (Greenville), David Allen (Marquette, MI), Ron Weyher (Iron River, MI), and Paul Inman (Appleton). Paul will be finishing his term on the Board in August as well as his work as Membership Chair. Get to know your Board and get involved. I am glad I did!



WLD Annual Meeting May 11, 2013 at the

Meeting: was called to order by Superintendent Mark Preussler at 12:48 PM. Gregg Condon presented remarks and personal reminisces to the entertainment of the members.

WLD Constitution Changes: With the possible application for 501-c-3 certification, James Cruthers offered several changes to the constitution. The NMRA members present cast a paper ballot.

Committee Chairs: James announced that committee chairs are needed for Convention, Membership, Company Store and Scout Coordinator.

WLD Fall Meet: The Fall Meet will be held in Rhinelander, WI on October 12, 2013. A flyer was handed out to all present and encouraged to make plans to attend.

Old Business: No old business was presented.

New Business: Roger Wurtzel motioned that the election ballots be destroyed. The motion was seconded by Paul Inman and passed unanimously.


Paul Inman, Paul Hilmer and Larry Easton were appointed as a committee to audit the Paymaster's report.

SO LONG TO C&NW'S LAKESHORE SUBDIVISION



Last year, May 25th, the CN received approval for abandonment of the line south of Manitowoc from just south of Newton (MP 69) through Cleveland to the county line (MP 62.2), where it meets the UP. It was expected that it would be taken out this year. Well, on May 20, 2013 I saw an A & K Railroad Materials truck heading south out of Manitowoc near Wal-Mart. I had my suspicions about its being in town so I thought I would check out the Cleveland area this week. After work on Tuesday, I drove down to Cleveland, not seeing any activity on the tracks along the interstate. However, when I crossed North Ave. in Cleveland I saw some equipment parked along the tracks near Washington Ave., the most southerly crossing in town. I drove down to the equipment and it was a semi-truck flatbed with some track equipment on it and an excavator/backhoe. No more of the rail or ties that the CN had removed was taken, but the track south of Washington Ave. south towards the county line has been brushed out in preparation of track removal.

As of mid-June 2013, the tracks are gone. The CN still serves a feed mill in Newton via Manitowoc, but a few hundred feet south of it the trackage back to Cleveland is gone. **—Joe Lallensack.**


